Del Mar College & Rebuild Texas Continuing Education Carpentry Training Program

The Del Mar College, Rebuild Texas: Carpentry Training Program is now accepting students for registration. The 1st program offering starts Monday, May 20, 2019 and ends Wednesday, July 24, 2019

The Del Mar College – Rebuild Texas, Carpentry Training Program

Texas continues to experience a growing demand for workers in the construction industry as we work to rebuild our communities and employ a construction trade’s workforce after the disaster of Hurricane Harvey. The Texas population continues to grow rapidly and Del Mar College (DMC) is committed to building a readiness program empowering students to move toward a better paying job in industries in need of qualified employees in the Coastal Bend area.

Del Mar College is in the business of training students for sustainable careers. The DMC Summer 2019 Carpentry Training Program begins May 20, 2019 with the foundation for Safety. Students kick-off the program taking Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA), a 30 Hour Construction Certification course that will teach students the skills, knowledge, and the safety or health hazards encountered on construction projects. Upon completion of the OSHA 30 Certification Course, students will transition into Intro to Blueprint Reading course. Students will also take two other courses; Intro to Carpentry, and Framing & General Construction. **Upon completion of the Carpentry Training Program, students will be ready for employment into the Workforce as an Entry-level Carpenter and can be referred to contracted employers for hire.**

OSHA 30 Hour Construction Certification Training

This course is a 4-day course starting on a Monday, June 10, 2019 from 8am-5pm and ends

Thursday June 13, 2019 from 8-5 for a total of 30 hours. **This course will be held in Rockport, TX at 1515 N Live Oak Street, Rockport, TX 78382.**

Please be on site ready for class by 7:45am.



30 HOUR CONSTRUCTION

The OSHA 30 Hour Construction industry course is the only course students will pay for. The course provides a comprehensive safety program designed for students involved in the construction industry. Students will recognize and evaluate hazards in the workplace and implement control measures including engineering, administrative, and personal protective equipment (PPE). Students will address the common occupational hazards; describe the components of effective workplace design and accident prevention programs; and demonstrate correct selection and safe use of PPE. **All construction trades training coursework require OSHA 30 as a pre-requisite. Students who have a current OSHA 30 certification may be exempted from the OSHA 30.** Upon successful completion of the course, participants will receive an OSHA 30-Hour Construction Department of Labor course completion card.

DFTG 1015 – Intro to Blueprint Reading – TUITION FREE

Intro to Blueprint Reading is an introductory blueprint reading for residential and light commercial construction. The course provides students with scale prints using architectural and engineering scales; identify construction blueprint symbols and abbreviations; interpret a set of construction contract documents, and correlate elevations, sections, details, plan views, schedules and general notes. This is a pass or fail course. The course grade is based on your score on the Module Exams and whether you complete the Performance Tests satisfactorily.

CNBT 1018 – Construction Tools & Techniques - TUITION FREE

Construction Tools and Techniques provides an introduction to the carpentry trade including safety, tools, equipment, terminology, and methods. Students will learn how to establish safe work practices; describe fasteners and adhesives; define terms associated with building materials utilized by carpenters; describe handling and storage procedures; demonstrate the use and care of tools and equipment; and perform mathematical computations used by the Carpenter. This is a pass or fail course. The course grade is based on your score on the Module Exams and whether you complete the Performance Tests satisfactorily.

CRPT 1001 - Framing & General Construction - TUITION FREE

Framing and General Construction provides students with the knowledge and skills required to erect wood frame structure with emphasis on layout and construction of floors, walls, and roofs. Training includes safety procedures for using hand and power tools and structural materials. Also carpentry maintenance common to any construction will be covered. Includes drywall repair; caulking, sealing, and weather-stripping; replacement of hinges and lock sets; glazing; and on-the-job safety with hand and power tools. Student will understand how to list, layout and construct components of wood frame structures, select, use, and maintain tools and equipment; and practice construction safety. Students will demonstrate safe-work habits; use, and maintain tools and equipment; identify basic material used to repair framed structures, windows, and doors. The course grade is based on your score on the Module Exams and whether you complete the Performance Tests satisfactorily.

Schedule

The program prepares students for immediate work into the construction and trades industry. The schedule begins with OSHA 30 Construction. Students seeking to register and pay for coursework, will do so by visiting the Center for Economic Development located at the corner of Staples and Kostoryz Road. Students who have been displaced and were affected by Hurricane Harvey are encouraged to visit their local Workforce Solutions office to determine eligibility and approval for financial assistance.

Students who wish to withdraw from the program MUST do so by the 3rd class day (census date). See the course schedule in the previous pages to determine the census date for dropping courses.
